News from Singapore

THE GIRLS' BRIGADE SINGAPORE (OVERSEAS EXTENSION WORK 2009)

Since 1993, GBS has initiated extension into Asia as part of our vision of bringing GB presence to every country in Asia.

On the home front, 2009 was a year whereby we challenged our officers to cross over to the other side, to consider adopting countries and providing training overseas. We conducted the first Overseas Extension training workshop at the Officers' Retreat, which was an informative and inspiring time as officers who have participated in our overseas work shared their experiences and testimonies.

The Girls' Brigade in Cambodia

Work continues in Cambodia where T-houses have been set up in various locations in the Toul Kork slum, the Stung Meanchey Dumpsite, the Widows' Island and Baray Village. The ladies are trained in life skills like weaving, sewing and cooking, while the girls join a version of the GB Four-Fold programme known as the Life+Plus Club focusing on literacy skills.

One Chance Project

Into its third year, the "One Chance Project" hopes to help girls, women and children in Cambodia by providing them with life skills training to secure gainful employment and to promote literacy among the children. Up to end of September 2009, the total amount of funds raised by GB companies and partners in Singapore was about S\$120,000.

The T-Houses are adopted by GB International as part of the One Chance Project. We are thankful for the donations from GB in different countries, and also the active participation of GB Malaysia and GB Brunei.

At Widows' Island, we completed training for one batch of 11 trainees in sewing. At the Stung Meanchey Dumpsite T-House, we partnered a church to conduct literacy

programmes for children and young adults. On average we have had about 13 children for the morning Khmer class, 15 for the afternoon Khmer class and 8 young adults learning English and now simple accounting as well. The T-House at Baray continues to train and employ women from nearby villagers to do weaving, sewing and most recently natural dyeing. In the pipeline are expansion plans for the building to offer other skills training like soap making, culinary skills and basic computer skills. At the Toul Kork Slum area, GBC runs the Life+Plus Club programme at a learning centre on a weekly basis. In addition, since 2009, funds raised from the Low Guat Tin Challenge by the primary companies were used to start a sponsorship programme covering the tuition fees, shoes and uniforms of 15 girls from the slums.

In total, about 60 women and 160 girls participate in our programmes in Cambodia.

The Girls' Brigade in Indonesia

Since 2002, GBS has started projects in Indonesia. These are platforms for GB Officers and girls to serve in, and Officers from GBS have been volunteering as trainers at the schools and T-Houses. GBS has started the GB programme in schools in Surabaya and West Kalimantan. This year, teams of officers went to the schools to provide training in running the GB Programme. In Aceh we have collaborated with a partner to set up a T-House providing training in ginger tea and bag making. In Malang, a team was sent from GBS to train the local leaders. The Life+Plus Club is being run on a weekly basis with 40 children/teenagers, as well as the 40 mothers of these children/teenagers who are from the slum and village areas.

Two key programmes from The Girls' Brigade Singapore that we would like to share are our Officers' Retreat 2009 and Lead Like Jesus Leadership Encounter.

Officers' Retreat 2009

A total of 147 participants comprising Exco members, officers, volunteers and staff had a fruitful weekend at Sofitel Palm Resort, Senai, Johore on 5 and 6 September.

The theme of the retreat was 'Come Together, Looking Up, Reaching Out'. Various EXCO members led in different segments of the programme.

Rev Sng led the devotion. The Team building session was led by Mr Kenneth Kwan from Deep Impact. Officers were given four electives for the workshops, namely Understanding Diversity, Power of Words, Making Choices and Crossing over with GB into Asia.

Lead Like Jesus Leadership Encounter

The Girls' Brigade Singapore was given the privilege of hosting the Lead Like Jesus Asia Pacific Centre. The Centre was launched on 2 – 3 October 2009 with 140 participants from GB, Churches and Market place leaders. This well attended event drew people from all walks of life who desired to impact their worlds with a new leadership model that elevates service and relationships to an equal importance with tasks. Participants had travelled from Australia, India, Malaysia, Hong Kong, Indonesia and New Zealand as well as those living in Singapore.

Following this event, 45 people were trained as Lead Like Jesus facilitators. These new facilitators have been equipped with the tools and materials needed to spread the Lead Like Jesus message throughout their spheres of influence in the Asia/Pacific Rim.

What's Lead Like Jesus? It is a two day highly interactive, participant-centred workshop that unpacks the Lead Like Jesus framework of the Heart, Head, Hands and Habits of leadership in a collegial environment. Originally designed by Ken Blanchard and Phil Hodges and recently updated with content from Lead Like Jesus: Lessons from the Greatest Leadership Role Model of All Time, The Encounter experience is transformational. It's a great experience provided by trained and certified Lead Like Jesus facilitators.

The Girls' Brigade Singapore has included the Lead Like Jesus Encounter as part of it's officer's training process for new officers. The training manuals are now available at the GB Shoppe.

This winter saw the launch of the new Girls' Brigade England & Wales website – complete with a brand new web address www.girlsb.org.uk.

'When we were thinking through the aims and audiences of the website we came to the conclusion that a web is a huge window to the world (guess that's why it's called the world-wide web!),' says Ruth Gilson, National Director, GB England & Wales.

'This meant we asked questions like "what do we want the world to see about GB on the home page?" and we decided the best glimpse to give is about the life of GB and the great things that are happening.

'So we're committed to the web being a place that anyone – whether it's the general public, churches, other organisations, girls, parents, or GB leaders – can visit and hopefully be welcomed, encouraged and interested in all that's occurring in and through this amazing movement called GB!'

In GB there's lots of 'leader speak' that's really only helpful for people like GB leaders, such as information and downloadable forms, so there's also a very special area on the website that is JUST for GB leaders.

'Only commissioned leaders in GB England & Wales will be able to access this area fully, because it is a GB leadership toolkit and exclusive to GB members,' says Ruth.

'Part of this leaders' only web area is a resources zone that will grow and develop over the coming months and years and, instead of just giving away our great resources to everyone who looks at the web, only those who've subscribed to GB will be able to receive these resources. Commissioned leaders will be automatically subscribed into this zone, as part of their annual membership contribution.'
